Typical Structure of a Story

These are the building blocks of a story:

Beginning

- Establishes the setting
 - Time period
 - Weather
 - Location
- Introduces the characters
- □ Hooks the reading (Dramatic Question)
- Sets up the conflict

Middle

- Develops the characters (reader learns more about them)
- □ Events are revealed in a logical manner (chronological order)
- Rising Action
 - Events are leading to a climax (the most exciting part of the story)
 - The conflict is becoming clearer to the reader
 - o Suspense is building
 - o Action is getting more intense
- Climax (this is the major conflict in the story)

<u>End</u>

- □ The story starts coming to a close
- Loose ends are being tied up
- □ We find out what happens to all the characters
- \Box The reader is left feeling settled that everything has worked out
- □ There are no more questions in the readers mind
